Can you write down:

- 1. A person/people on earth they care about.
- 2. A place on earth they care about.
- 3. Something on the earth they care about.

Talk with a grown up about the difference between natural and man- made places on earth.

Talk about an object you really care about. How do you look after it?

Talk about the fact that we all care for things in this world. When we care for something, we have some responsibility for it, and we are **stewards** of it. What do you think the word 'steward' means? There are stewards at football matches, concerts or even at church. When we *look after something*, this is called **stewardship**. Often, the word stewardship is used to refer to a responsibility to take care of something that is owned by someone else.

Thinking about STEWARDSHIP

Go outside (or if that's not possible look out of the window), be still and take notice of the world you can see. Focus on any things of nature – sky, clouds, birds, trees. Write a poem or draw or paint a picture to represent what you care for on the earth. You could take photographs instead and create a photo collage of the things around you today that you really care about or you could look back through old photos and find a selection you care about.

It's important to think about how we show care for these people, places or things.
