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Our uniform shows that we are part of the St. Cuthbert's RC Primary School community. We have the highest expectations from our students with regards to school uniform and

appearance, and strongly believe that our high standards promote positive behaviour, support effective teaching and learning and contribute to the ethos of the school.

From September 2020, Children will be in full school uniform and must have a full indoor and outdoor PE kit (we will be doing far more outdoor PE next year)

(Children in Reception Class should bring a labelled pair of Wellingtons in their first week that can be left in school for outdoor play).

Footwear:

- Pupils must wear closed-toed, hard-soled, all black plain shoes with a flat sole.
- If black trainers are worn, they should be plain black with no coloured logos.
- Footwear with flashing lights is not appropriate for school.
- If boots are worn these should also be plain black. If boots are large and prevent children from sitting comfortably on the floor they may be asked to change into their PE shoes whilst inside the school building.
- Children should have a pair of shoes they can change into indoors

School specific items are available from JD fashions in Seaham. The items above are readily available from the high street – if parents and carers find any item difficult to obtain, please contact the school office. Our uniform has been kept simple to avoid unnecessary expense.

Please label all uniform with your child's name as we have so much PE kit and school jumpers that go missing. We will not be able to use spare PE kits.

- During this time of restrictions due to COVID-19, the days that your child has PE, children should come to school dressed in their outdoor PE kit. This minimises the number of children in a cloakroom collecting bags and different rooms being used to change in.
- Children MAY bring a bag into school but please do not send in anything unnecessary. Indoor PE kit should remain in school in a separate bag.
- We are following public health advice that no jewellery should be worn apart from a wristwatch (this means no earrings at all).
- We will be making the use of the field at playtimes and using classroom doors rather than shared doors and corridors to minimise contact between classes, so please send your child with a pair of indoor shoes (this can be the plimsolls they have for indoor PE).
- Hair bands, ribbons/bows or 'scrunchies' should be plain and either maroon or black or white in colour. Hair bands should not have large flowers/cat ears attached.
- Make up and nail varnish should not be worn to school. False nails should not be worn.
- Extreme hairstyles are not appropriate for school. The use of styling products should be kept to a minimum and children should not have decorative patterns or 'tram lines' cut into their hair or have their hair coloured or dyed.
- For health and safety reasons and to ensure it does not distract from learning, we advise that long hair be tied back.
