As we come to the end of another lockdown in the school year, I would like to thank all of our children, staff and parents for their hard work, dedication, patience and resilience over the last 8 school weeks (I know it feels like longer!).

We have re-evaluated our risk assessment (again) and the systems we had in place before Christmas. A full reopening document is available on parent pay for you to read.

### Please note:

- Pupils, staff and other adults must not enter school premises if they are displaying any symptoms
  of COVID-19 or a member of their household is displaying symptoms or they have had a positive
  test result. Pupils must not attend if they or anyone in their household is waiting for the results of a
  test.
- Pupils will be entering/exiting school at the same place as they were before Christmas. Pick up times remain the same, but drop off times are slightly different:

Reception - Drop off 8.40-8.55am, pick up 3pm (Daisy Path gate)

Year 1 - Drop off 8.40-8.55am, pick up 3.15pm (Daisy Path gate)

Year 2 - Drop off 8.40-8.55am, pick up 3.15pm (main yard)

Year 3 - Drop off 8.40-8.55am, pick up 3.15pm (main yard)

Year 4 - Drop off 8.40-8.55am, pick up 3.25pm (main yard)

Year 5 - Drop off 8.40-8.55am, pick up 3.25pm (main yard)


Year 6 - Drop off 8.40-8.55am, pick up 3.25pm (main yard)

Please note: arrival times for ALL PUPILS are between 8:40 and 8:55am. If you need your child to be in school before this time, you must book a slot at breakfast club.

- Please wear a face mask when collecting your child and **only one adult** should collect your child. Please follow the one way system on the main yard. Adults must not congregate at the gate or in the church car park. Your Y5/6 child can walk home if we have written permission.
- Parents and carers should not come to the school entrance without an appointment.
- Pupils are not permitted to bring in toys or own stationery from home. Pupils should only bring essential items lunch box/water bottle.
- Pupils should wear full school uniform or their PE uniform on PE days. Any coloured hair must be returned to their normal colour and please don't have tram lines cut into hairstyles.
- Please return all devices and pupil books on Monday. These should be brought to school in a
  plastic bag so they can be quarantined.
- Breakfast club will resume on Monday 8th March (8am-8.30am). Pupils will come to the main entrance. If you attended school before Christmas your place at breakfast club still stands.

  Many thanks for your support in keeping our school and community safe.

Many thanks for your co-operation in dressing children in the appropriate school uniform. Just a reminder of our uniform policy during COVID:

Children will be in full school uniform and have a full indoor and outdoor PE kit

## **School uniform:**

- -School jumper or cardigan
- -White polo shirt or blouse (it does not have to have the school logo on)
- -Black/grey trousers or skirt/pinafore \*No leggings or short, lycra skirts
- -Black school shoes or plain black trainers

# PE Kit:

- -School shorts and t-shirt and plimsolls for indoor PE
- -Black or grey jogging bottoms or leggings, school t-shirt and either school jumper or a black, maroon or grey hoodie with outdoor trainers for outdoor PE.
  - \*Please label all uniform with your child's name as we have so much PE kit and school jumpers that go missing. We will not be able to use spare PE kits.
- •We are still following public health advice that no jewellery should be worn apart from a wristwatch (this means no earrings at all).
- •We will be making the use of the field at playtimes and using classroom doors rather than shared doors and corridors to minimise contact between classes, so please send your child with a pair of indoor shoes (this can be the plimsolls they have for indoor PE).
