### **ATTENDANCE**

Please do not be offended if you have received an attendance letter from us. It is our duty to track attendance and keep you informed. Government departments track attendance figures and it is considered that attendance of 90% or below is persistent absence which should be closely monitored by school staff. We want to work with you to avoid your child's attendance becoming any lower.

Likewise it is really important that we work together to ensure children are in school on time. Arriving late is unsettling for children and learning begins promptly at 8.50am. The first lesson of the day is maths so regularly arriving late means your child is missing out on vital education. The school bell now works again so the gates will be shut at 8.50am prompt. Anyone later than this should be brought to reception by an adult.

Being 10 minutes late every day is the equivalent of 7 whole days over a year! Every second counts!

### **UNIFORM REMINDERS**

Children are allowed to wear black trainers as part of their school uniform, but they should be all black; not white soles or colourful stripes.

Children are not allowed to wear earrings for school and if they have to wear plastic retainers, these are not allowed for PE.

Children with long hair should have their hair tied up in line with the school uniform policy and children should not have tram lines cut into their hair or their hair dyed.

If you choose not to wear school branded PE kit, then all hoodies and tracksuit bottoms/leggings should be unbranded (e.g.not Nike/Adidas). **PE bottoms should** be **NAVY not black**.

Thank you for your patience as we try to navigate a new way of signing up to after school clubs. Hopefully this will be more effective in the long run but we have naturally run into some teething problems as we use this system for the first time. This now appears to be resolved.

### RIGHTS RESPECTING Holocaust Memorial Day - 27th January

Article 1 - Everyone under 18 has rights

Article 4 - The government has a right to make sure your rights are protected. They must help your family to protect your rights and create an environment where you can grow and reach your potential.

Article 41 - The laws of the country should apply protection for children.

Holocaust Memorial Day is the day for everyone to remember the millions of people murdered in the Holocaust, under Nazi Persecution, and in the genocides which followed in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia, and Darfur. The theme in 2024 is 'For a Better Future'.

'That is when the trouble started for the Jews. Our freedom was severely restricted by a series of Anti Jewish decrees.'

(Anne Frank diary entry, 20th June 1942 reflecting on May 1940 when the Germans arrived in the Netherlands)
