

HOW WE LEARN SPELLINGS

- We will give a rule or pattern where possible e.g.
 adding -ed
- Children will get a list of words to learn but should try to learn the rule and apply it to the root word
 e.g. hop + ed = hopped hope + ed = hoped
- There will be further examples on spelling shed to practise
- Sometimes the word lists will be words that do not follow a rule




Holidays and absence

e-safety


- Our computing curriculum is updated every year to be more relevant.


