





# **Our School Day**



Pupils can be dropped off at school from 8:35 am and the bell goes for the start of the school day at 8:50 am. School finishes at 3:10 pm for EYFS, 3:15 pm for KS1 and 3:25 pm for KS2.

#### **Breakfast Club**

Club is open every morning from 7.45 am and provides a healthy breakfast with familiar staff from our TAs and Lunchtime Supervisors. There is a chance to play, be active and socialise with friends with games and activities to get our brains ready for the day. The cost of Breakfast Club is £2.50 per day for 1 - 3 days or £10.00 for 4 - 5 days.

#### Lunch time

Our award-winning cook, Jan, and her team serve up hot and healthy meals in lots of creative ways and encourage children to taste new things, as well as packing in lots of hidden veg for those reluctant to try! Our gardening club also grow things in our allotment that are prepared and served to pupils. Children, staff and visitors all comment on our fantastic lunches.

#### **After School Clubs**

Our after-school clubs vary over the year and range from gardening, to art to a multitude of sports and games. Clubs are mostly run by staff in school and are either free or cost a nominal amount to cover resources. We work closely with local sports coaches to make links to outside clubs and pride ourselves on the provision we offer.



# Our Curriculum

## **Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)**



Children are supported in their first steps in learning from their very first visit to school. Every child deserves the best possible start in life and support to fulfil their potential and at St Cuthbert's our dedicated staff and indoor and outdoor learning areas enable us to give our children excellent foundations on which to build their talents as they grow. Our newest pupils are also cared for by Year 6 buddies who spend time helping them learn, play, grow and build strong friendships.

Parental involvement with school begins even before children start Reception with an invitation to visit the school and meet their child's teacher. Parental consultation meetings are held in the Autumn and Spring Term at which parents are invited to discuss their child's progress. We build strong relationships with home through our online system, Tapestry, which allows parents to see their child's successes in class as well as sharing experiences and achievements at home.

#### Key Stage 1 & 2

Our curriculum has been carefully planned and sequenced so that from EYFS, pupils learn progressively and leave us ready for their next step in education. We work closely with our family of schools at Bishop Chadwick Catholic Education Trust to ensure that what our children learn and know when they leave us builds seamlessly into their learning at our secondary schools within the Trust.

- We have held Gold School Games status for 5 years and have now achieved Platinum School Games status. We recognise the importance of being active for all our pupils.
- We use our outdoor area for learning both in lessons and through developing our grounds for Outdoor Play & Learning (OPAL) for all pupils.

## **Safeguarding**

#### **SEND**

Staff are supported by a highly skilled SEND Co-ordinator within school who oversees the whole provision. We may also seek advice and recommendations from other professionals to ensure our pupils are getting the best support. Best practice involves clear communication between home and school and we listen closely to parents/carers and pupils themselves to ensure the best possible outcomes for all our pupils.

# **Chadwick's Kitchen**



Our award winning in-house catering team Chadwick's Kitchen, provide catering services across the Trust.

We use fresh ingredients to prepare healthy and nutritionally balanced meals each day. The majority of our menus are homemade by our chefs in our kitchens.

Staff are trained to accommodate medical diets and work in partnership with parents to ensure these needs are met. As part of the Trust's commitment to sustainability, we regularly review food miles and continue to work to reduce food waste.

Parents/Carers can pay for school meals using ParentPay, and can view meal choices and account balance online.

Students entitled to free meals are allowed to purchase food to the value of a free school meal allowance daily. Students also have the option to bring a packed lunch (nuts or nut-based products aren't permitted).
